1. NATURAL FLAVOURS

The best flavours can be found in the forests of Finland. Berries, mushrooms and wild herbs are best when picked yourself, and a walk in the woods is both soothing and exhilarating at the same time. In wintertime, walking across the frozen sea and ice fishing are unforgettable experiences.

2. FINNISH CUISINE

The Michelin-awarded Chef & Sommelier, Ask and Olo are great places to discover Finnish cuisine. Less formal establishments include Juuri where vou can eniov exquisite Finnish tapas ("sapas"), Kolmon3n and Loung3 are great casual eats and for a great Kaurismäki atmosphere, try Sea Horse or Cella.

3. MARKET HALLS

The indoor market halls are great for enjoying the hustle and bustle and meeting the locals. I get my fish, meat and cheese from Hakaniemi Market Hall - Lentävä Lehmä ("Flying Cow") is the best cheese shop in town.

4. STREET FOOD

Helsinki is experiencing a real boom in street food. The most interesting event is Restaurant Day, when locals set up their own pop-up restaurants throughout the city. Check out also the food bicycles rolling around the city in the summertime.

5. LET'S EAT TOGETHER!

Food always tastes best when enjoyed with friends. Eating out is also a great way to meet the locals. In summertime you can get together at a picnic in the park, beside the sea or on an island. Helsinki also has many public grilling places - my favourites are at Pikku Leikosaari, the Abattoir
